

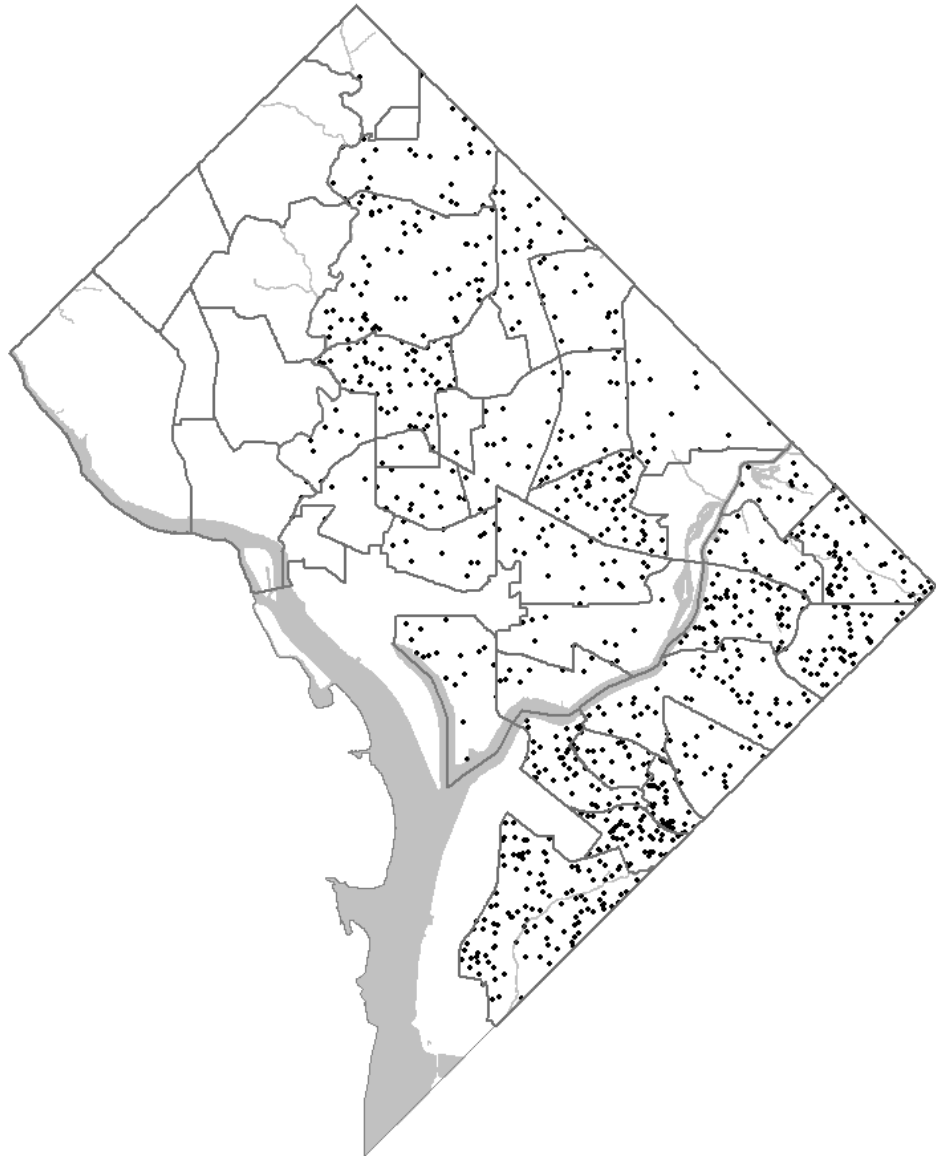

● = 1 teen birth

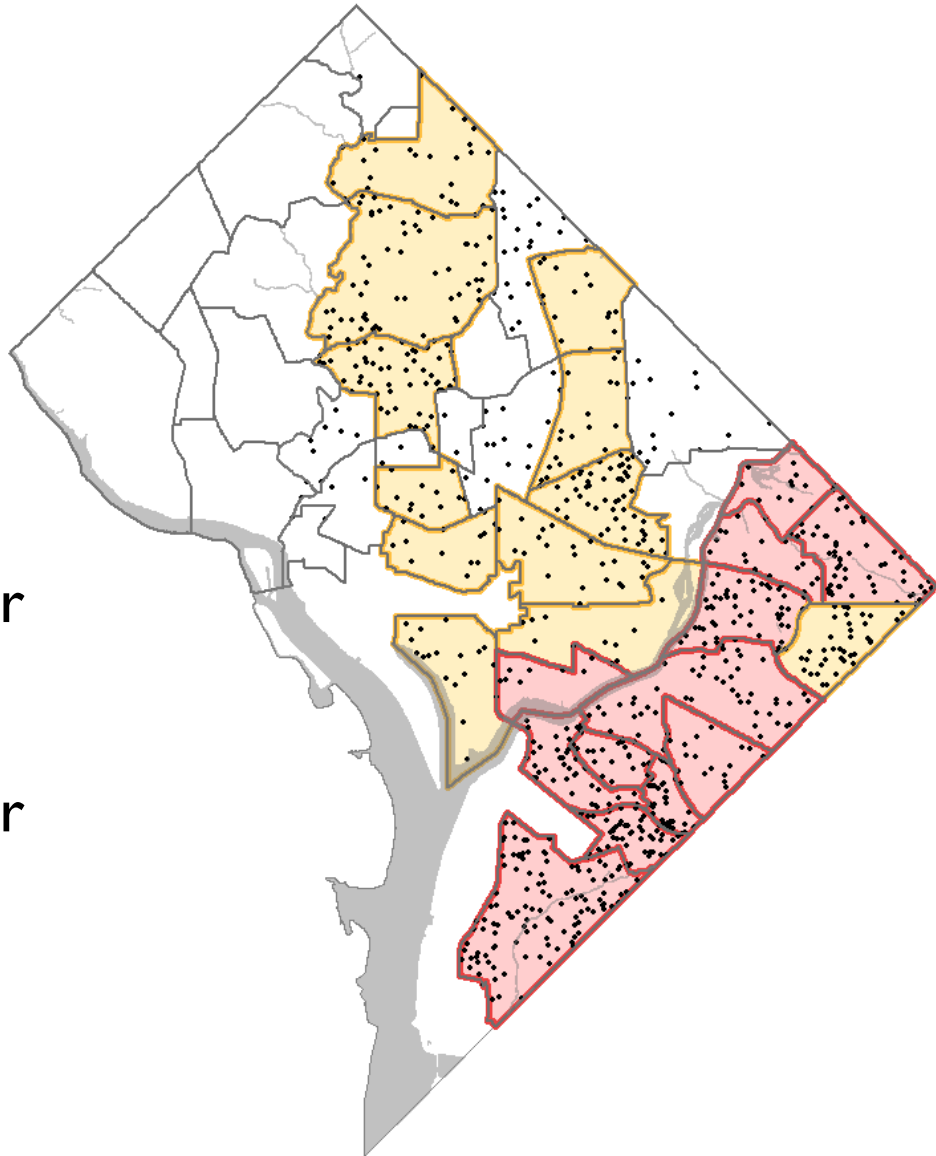

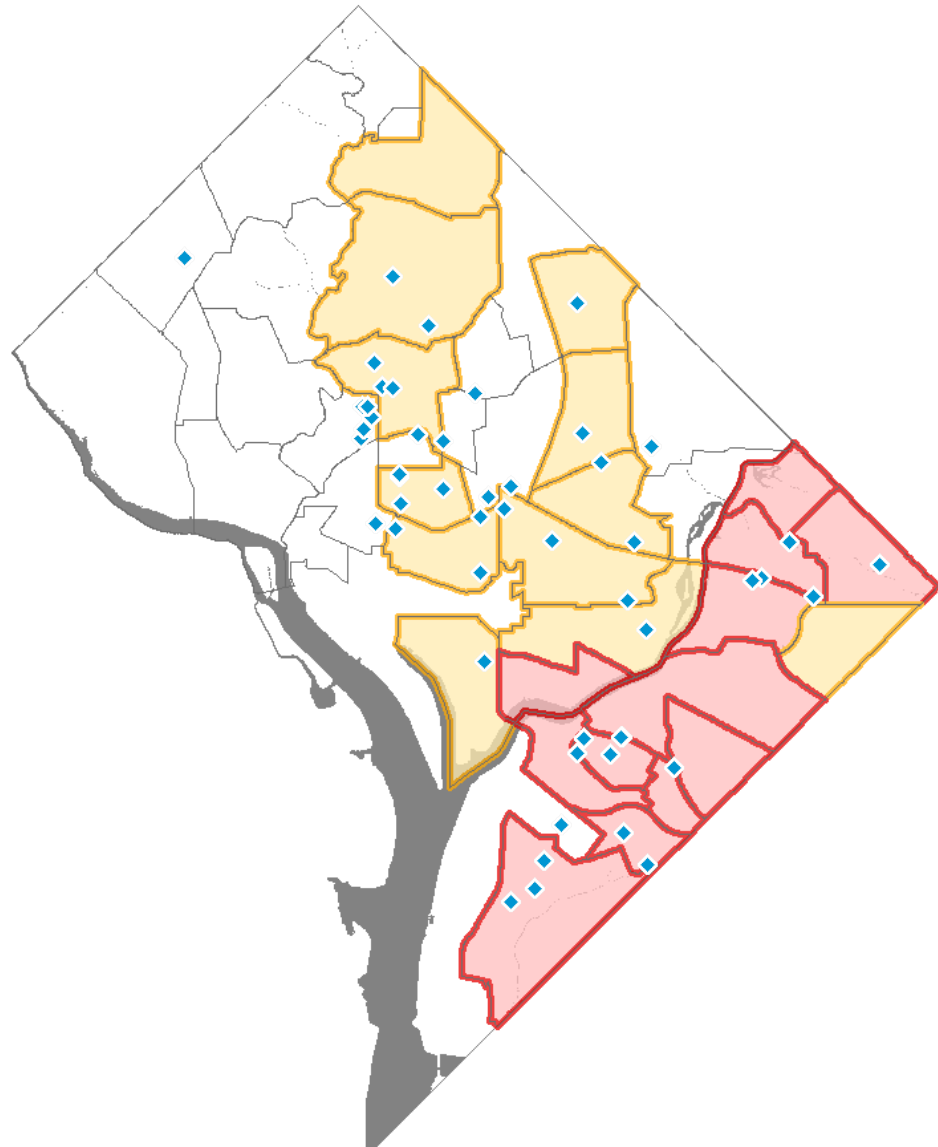

Teen birth rate over 50 per 1,000

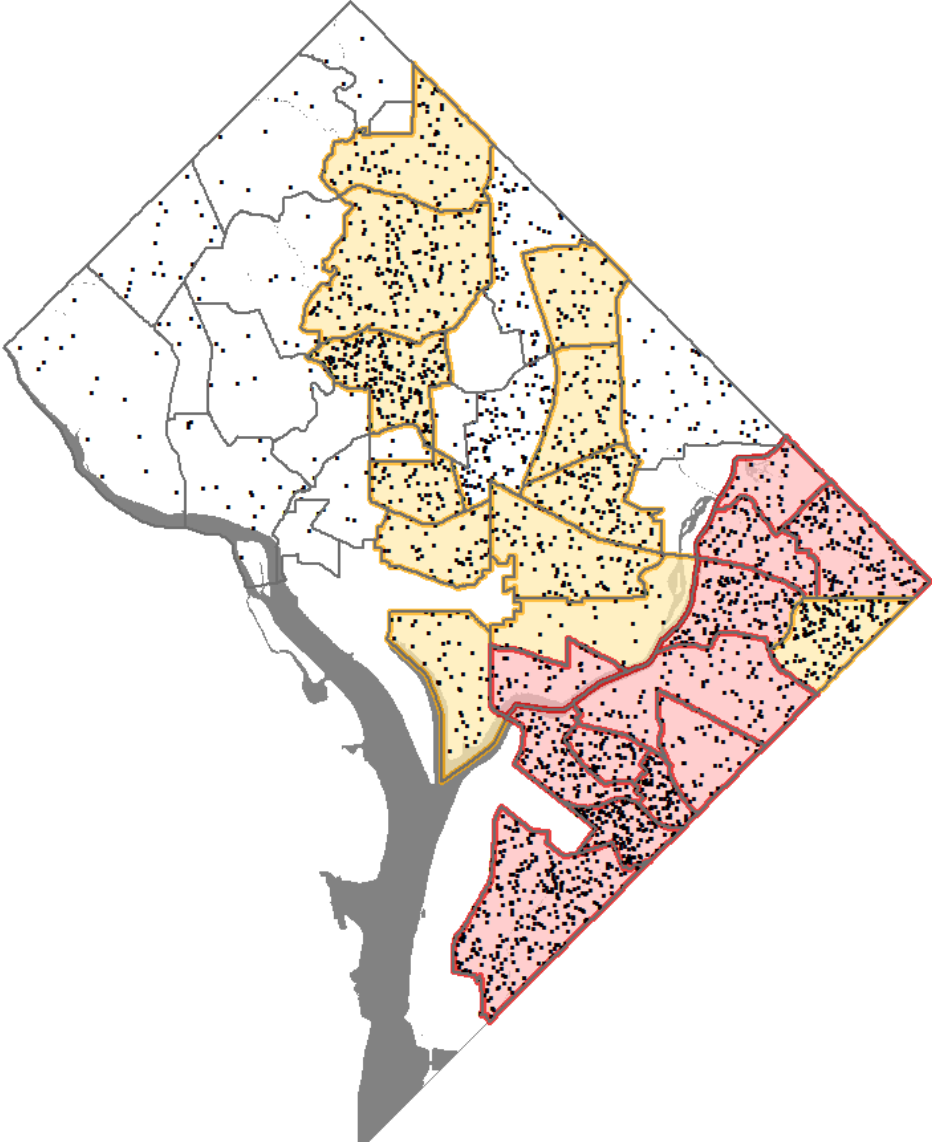
Teen birth rate over 75 per 1,000



Primary care sites

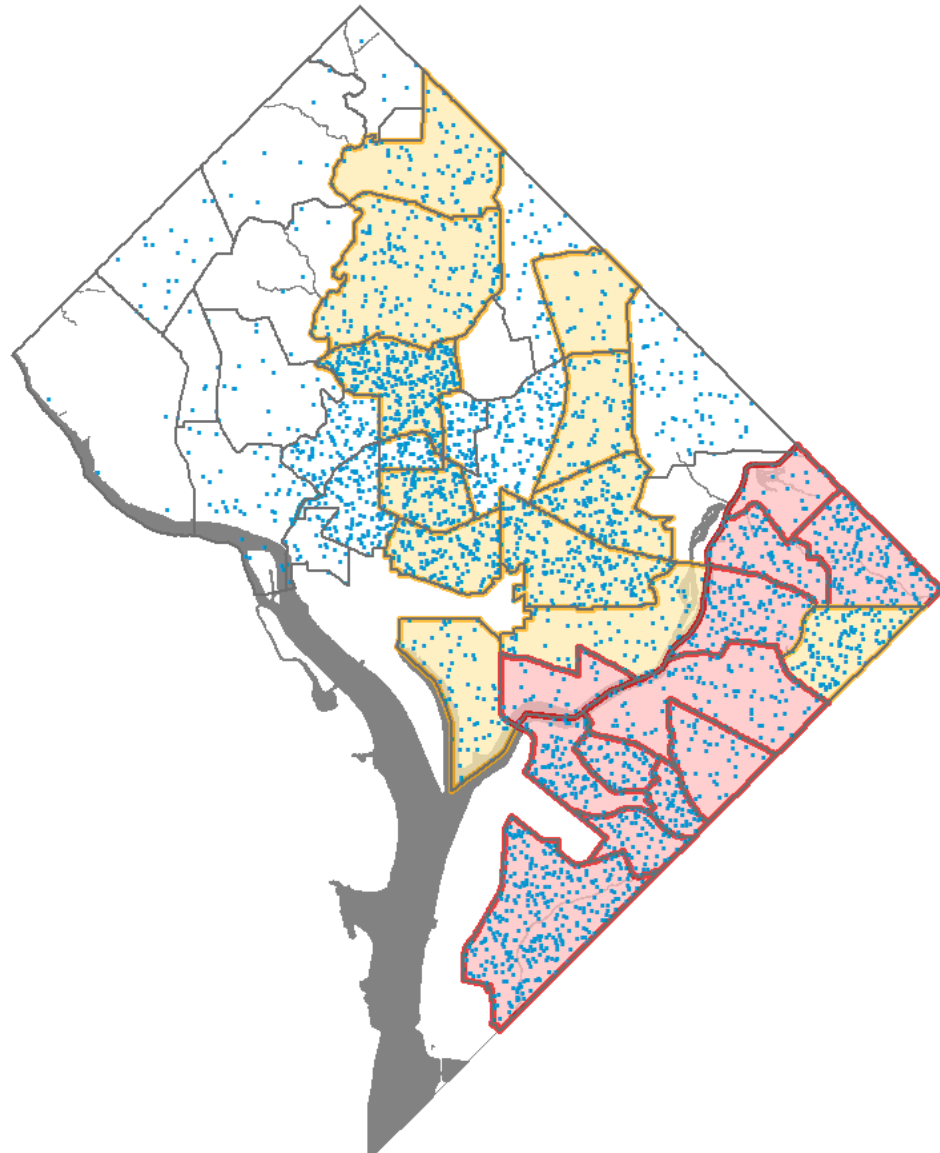


Single-female headed families



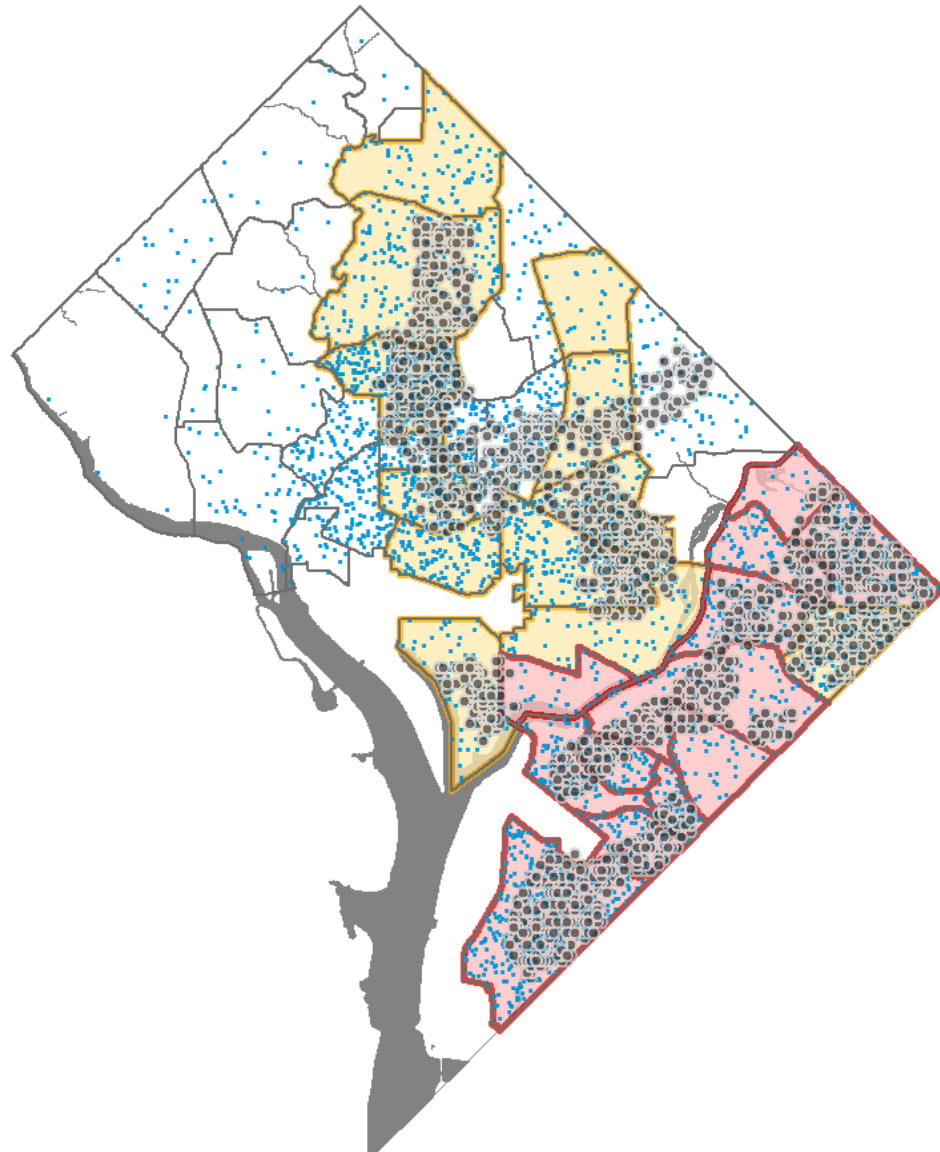

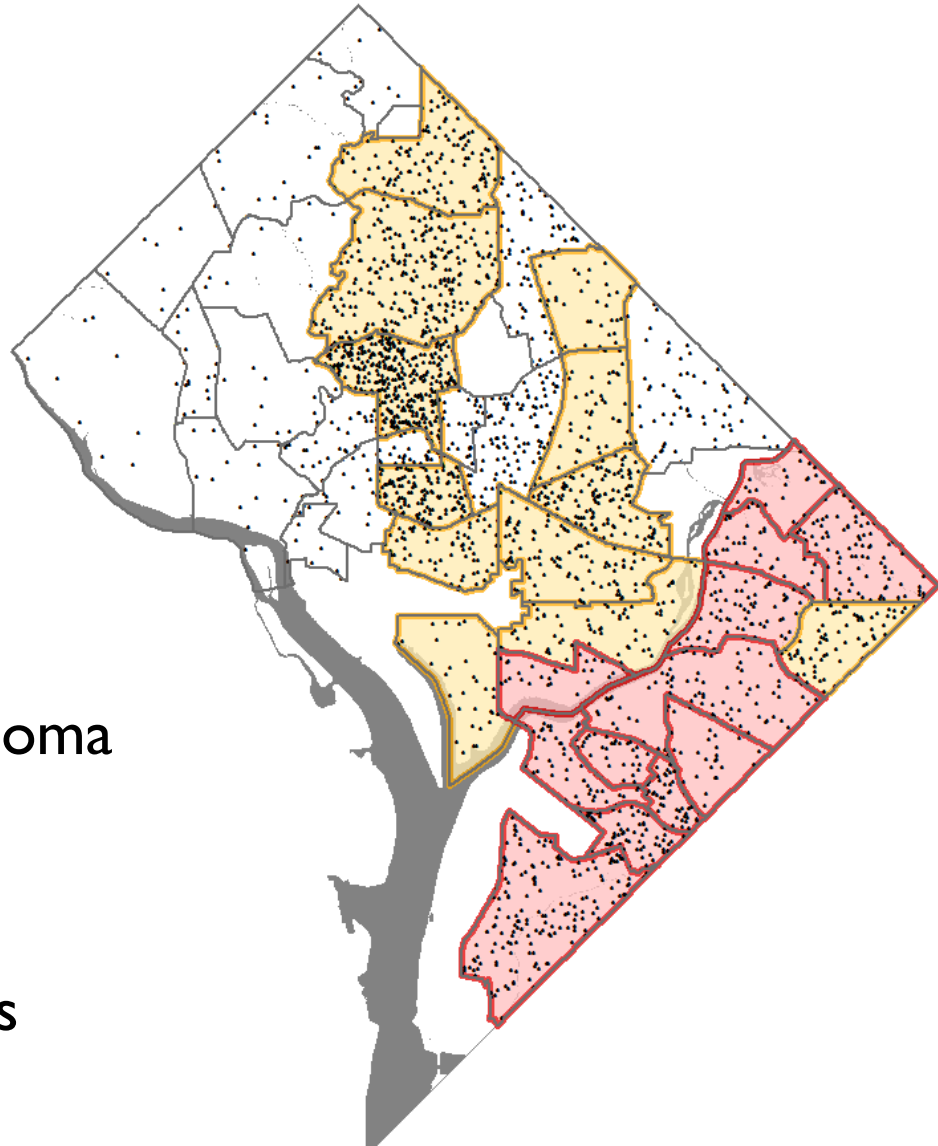
Violent crimes & Gunshots

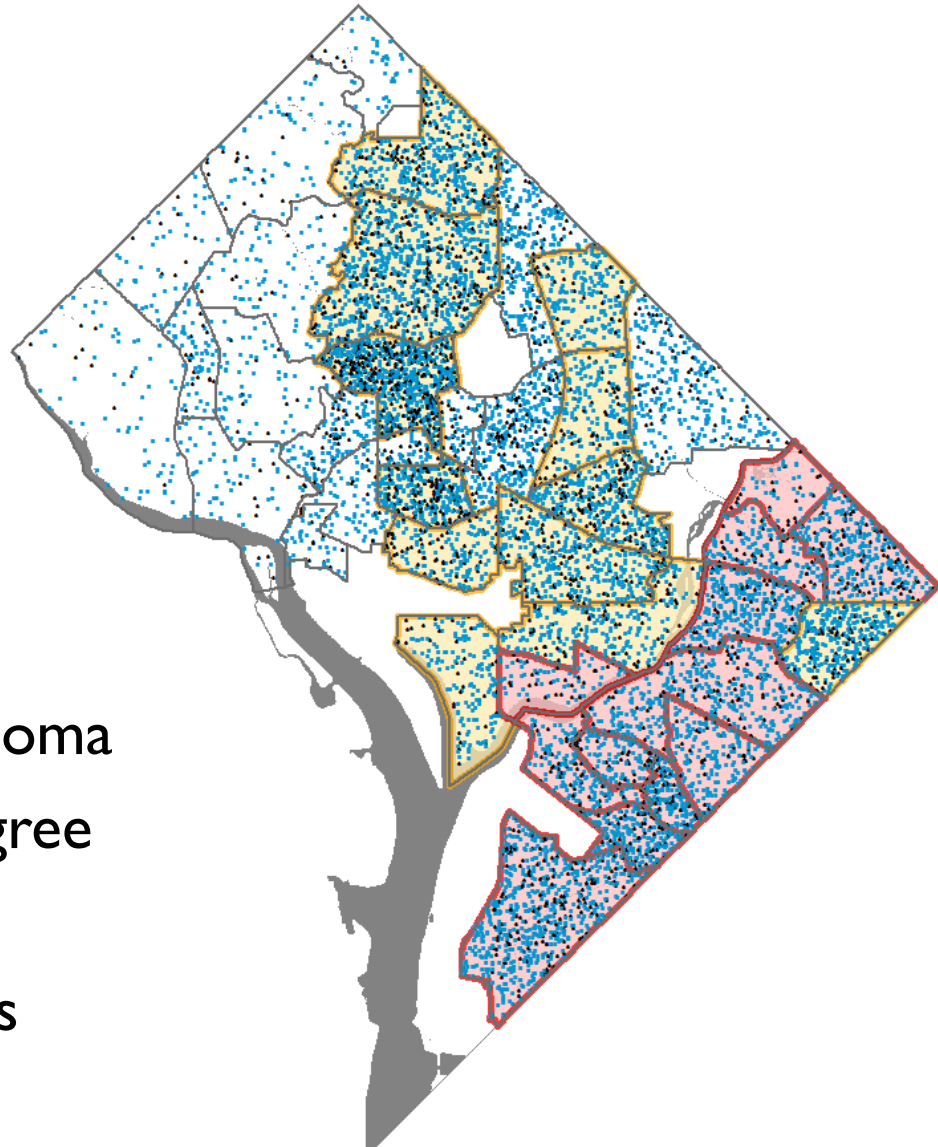
Education (25 years and older)

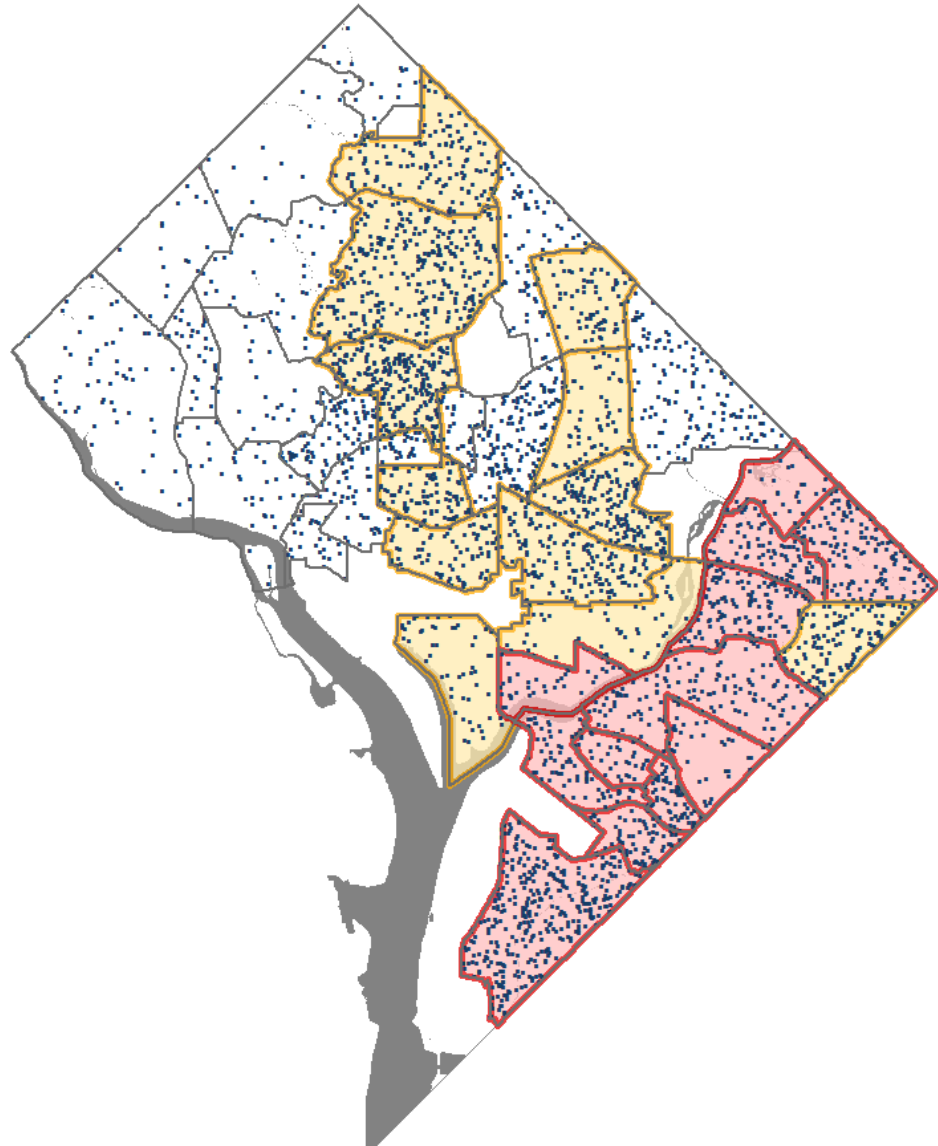

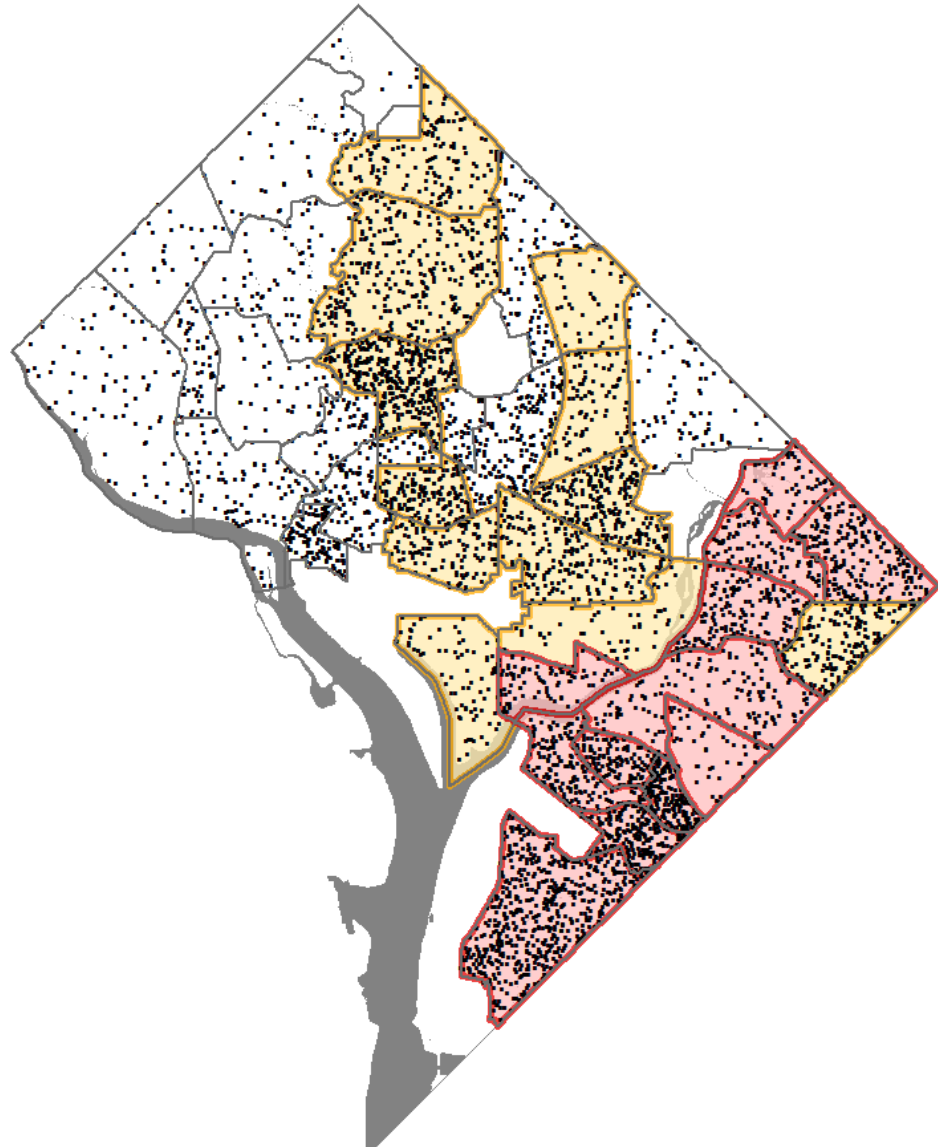

Unemployed (16 years and older)



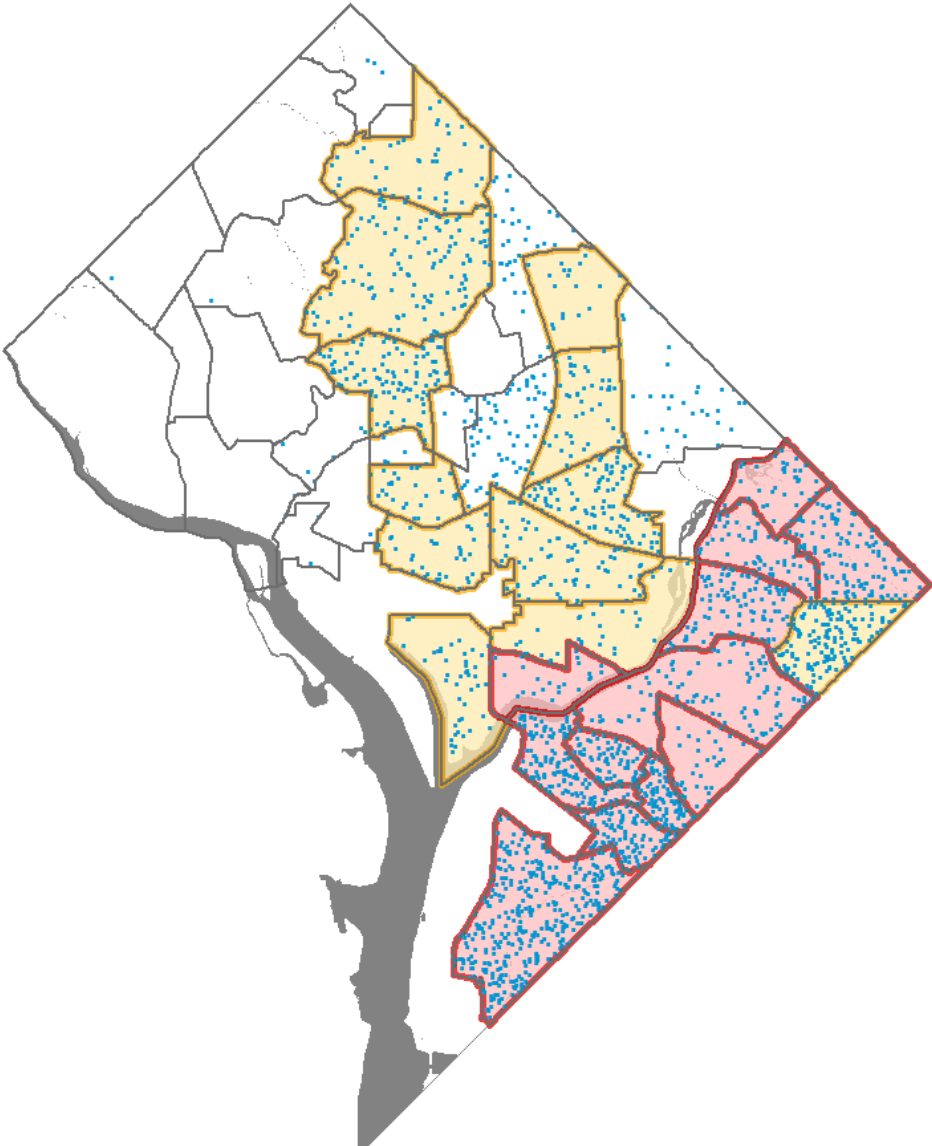

Person below poverty



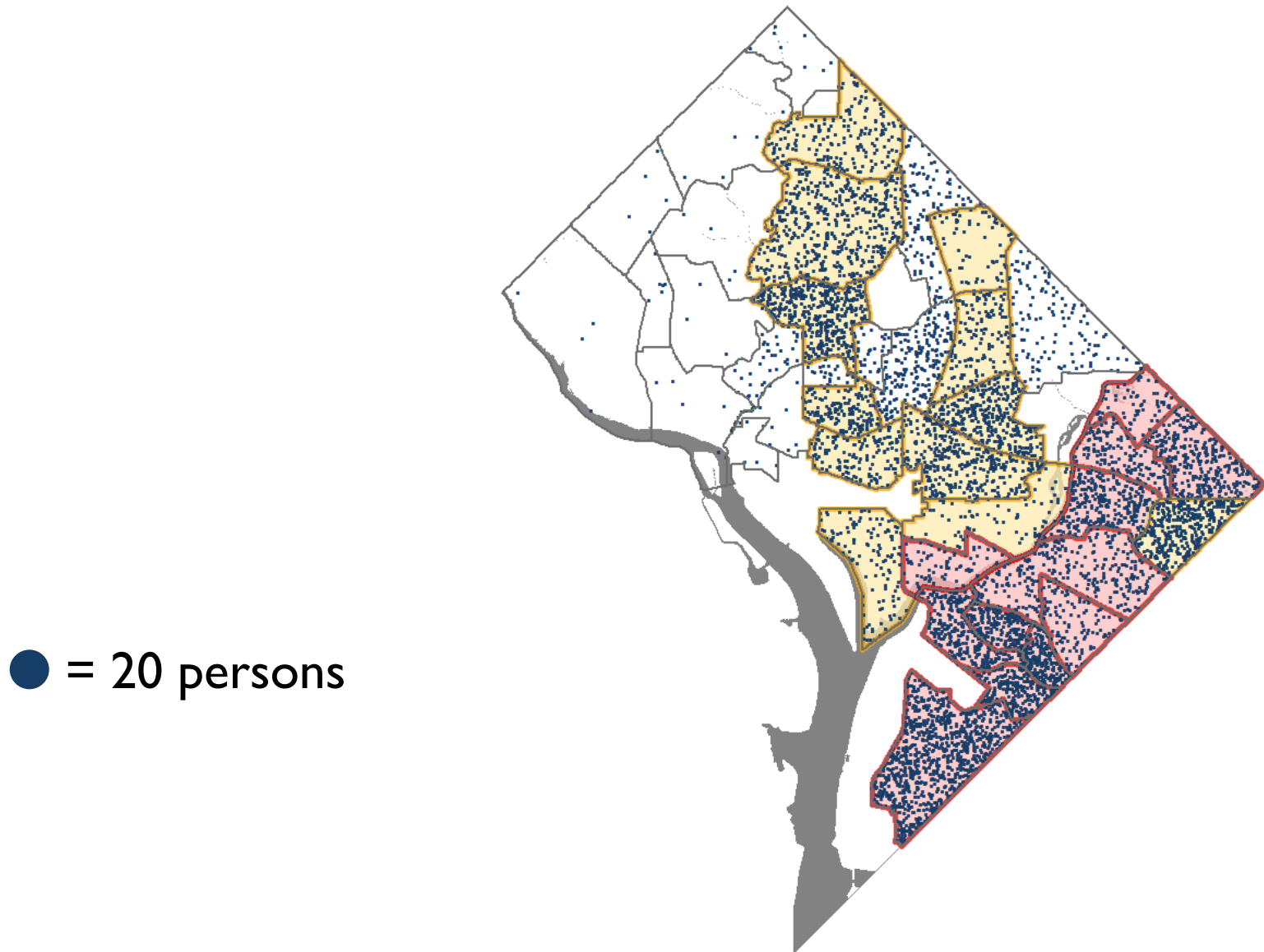
